How to Study the Bible

Helpful Suggestions

1. Pray -
 - Before reading, ask God to speak to you through His Word.
2. Read -
 - Read slowly, carefully, and thoughtfully.
 - Go for quality and not quantity.
 - Focus on verses that jump out at you, or where God is speaking to you.
3. Write -
 - Keep a personal journal to help your study.
 - Write verses that were important to you.
 - Write questions you may have.
 - Write new things you learned.
 - Write things to look up later.
4. Apply -
 - How do these verses apply to you?
 - What is God telling you to change or to do?
 - Write how it applies into your journal.
5. Pray -
 - Thank God for the truths He revealed to you.
 - Ask for His help in applying these truths in your life.
6. Reflect -
 - Throughout the day, think about what you read.
 - Ponder the main ideas and your responses.
7. Share -
 - Tell others about what you learned.
 - Seek answers to the questions you listed.
